As a reminder. Re: Imagine is the product of the Transformational leadership learning Course and from it there were conversations with Blaydon leading to their Warm Welcome initiative, as well as explorations with Sunniside. Looking afresh at this the CLT felt that what may draw us together as a circuit as well as reach out to our communities were "one off "events, that people could "buy into" for a season, and then do something else.

Our first re: Imagine event was Christmas Continued where many across the circuit, through a small group kindly organised, carol singing at the Land of Oak and Iron on 29th December. At that event we gave away 100 keyrings with a blessing and the circuit website, over 30 leaflets, to those who wanted to know more, a lot of chocolate angels, and had a great representation of singers across the circuit about 40 of us singing the carols.

The next idea, following on from our Pilgrims on the Path, is to do a Prayer Walk A Perambulation Pilgrimage!! Around the circuit, stopping at each church. This would happen over a weekend, with each church creating a prayer station, and publicising that the church was open for prayer that morning.
